Ian Mickle

Ian Mickle, son of Laurie Macintosh and Rich Mickle of Milton, died suddenly December 19th in British Columbia, Canada. A student at the University of British Columbia, he was 22.



Ian was known for his love of whitewater kayaking. He was a member of the US Junior Freestyle Kayaking Team in 2002, 2003 and 2004. He attended Adventure Quest Academy of Vermont and Huge Experiences of Tennessee, both freestyle kayaking schools, with which he traveled worldwide. He paddled in Australia, Austria, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, New Zealand and 13 states in the US. He graduated from Milton High School in 2004 and was a member of the National Honor Society.

At 15, Ian was the youngest ever to be sponsored by Wave Sport Kayaks. He was also sponsored by Shred Ready Helmets and AT Paddles. He helped to raise the profile of whitewater kayaking locally, having been profiled in several Boston papers while training in Cohasset. He also received media coverage in kayaking videos, magazines, and on the web.

Ian was born in Oshawa, Ontario on December 8, 1986. His family lived outside of Toronto and outside of Boston. He was enrolled in French Immersion in both Canada and Milton; he played baseball, soccer and hockey, and found his love in the churning whitewater. He is survived by his maternal grandmother Rita Macintosh of Philadelphia, his parents, a brother Scott and sister Bonnie.
